Purpose

The purpose of this bulletin is to provide additional guidance for submission of local agency special provisions for the construction phase.

Background

In accordance with LAG 44.51, all FHWA funded projects and all State projects funded through WSDOT Local Programs, including local agency force projects, will be constructed in conformance with the current Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge, and Municipal Construction M 41-10, and approved mandatory GSPs that modify these specifications. The FHWA has retained approval to make changes to division 1 standard specification that 1) make changes to policy, 2) change content that materially affect the intent, or 3) change content that may affect federal eligibility or involve federal regulations. Local Programs must approve all revisions to Division 1 Standard Specifications (or GSPs) for federally funding projects.


Guidance

General Division 1 Review process

- Agency should submit division 1 special provisions to Region Local Program Engineer (RLPE) well
 in advance of the planned advertisement. Submittal should be accompanied by new Local
 Programs Check-in form. See LAG 44.51 for additional requirements. (see appendix A for the
 Local Programs Division 1 Spec Check-in form).
- 2. RLPE will perform their own review of the special provision package and may return it for correction.
- 3. RLPE will submit the package to Headquarters Local Programs (HQLP) for review and approval.
- 4. HQLP will review; If a special provision requires FHWA review we will coordinate with the FHWA division office.
- 5. When approved, HQLP will request the agency send a final version with all changes accepted (Clean Copy) that we will retain for our records. The clean copy documents what has been approved, will help local programs answer questions when clearing bids and reviewing change orders.

Local Agency Boilerplates

An agency may wish to submit a division 1 boilerplate to local programs that contains proposed changes to all division 1 special provisions. The boilerplate will be reviewed using the same process as a project special provision submittal. An agency should consider generating a boilerplate document if the agency



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has multiple changes to division 1 specification and/or has a large number of Federally funded projects planned in the coming year. The Standard Specifications are published once every year. The boilerplate should be updated and resubmitted when the Standard Specifications for the year becomes active for local agency projects and before the agency submits its first project - division 1 special provision package for review. HQLP will review agency boilerplates when there is adequate time but no later than when the first project is submitted. After an agency boilerplate is accepted by HQLP the agency may use these pre-approved changes to division 1 in their project division 1 – submittals. An agency may find that a previously approved boilerplate special provision may not be approved the next year. This is because Local Programs receives guidance and direction from the FHWA that changes over time.

Local Programs Division 1 – Check-In Form

Local Programs uses a program by the name of SPORT to track local agency projects. The program requires the use of Federal Aid Number. Many projects obtain their construction authorization during the review process of the division 1 special provisions. The form will enable the reviewer to efficiently review the special provisions.
